Foundation Photography Skills	Autumn Term 1	Students are introduced to the foundations of digital photography, including handling a camera safely, simple compositions, formal elements, and basic exposure and focus. They explore photographers' work	Builds core technical fluency and vocabulary, introduces purposeful recording, and lays the groundwork for all GCSE assessment objectives.	Art Design Technology
Developing Technical Control	Autumn Term 2	through short research tasks. Students improve control over exposure, contrast, depth and perspective. They explore composition techniques and trial a wider range of camera modes in studio and location tasks.	Strengthens AO2 by developing deliberate technical control and prepares students to plan and refine shoots independently at GCSE level.	Art Geography
Creative Techniques and Experimental Processes	Spring Term	Students explore collage, mixed media, movement photography and textural studies. They trial editing approaches and analyse photographers' work in greater depth.	Develops AO1 and AO3 through experimentation, research and reflective annotation, preparing students for GCSE portfolio development.	Art Drama English
Major Project: Planning, Photoshoots and Final Outcome	Summer Term	Students plan and complete a sustained project including multiple photoshoots, contact sheets, editing, research and evaluation.	Mirrors the GCSE portfolio process, building confidence with all assessment objectives and developing independence for Year 11.	Art English
