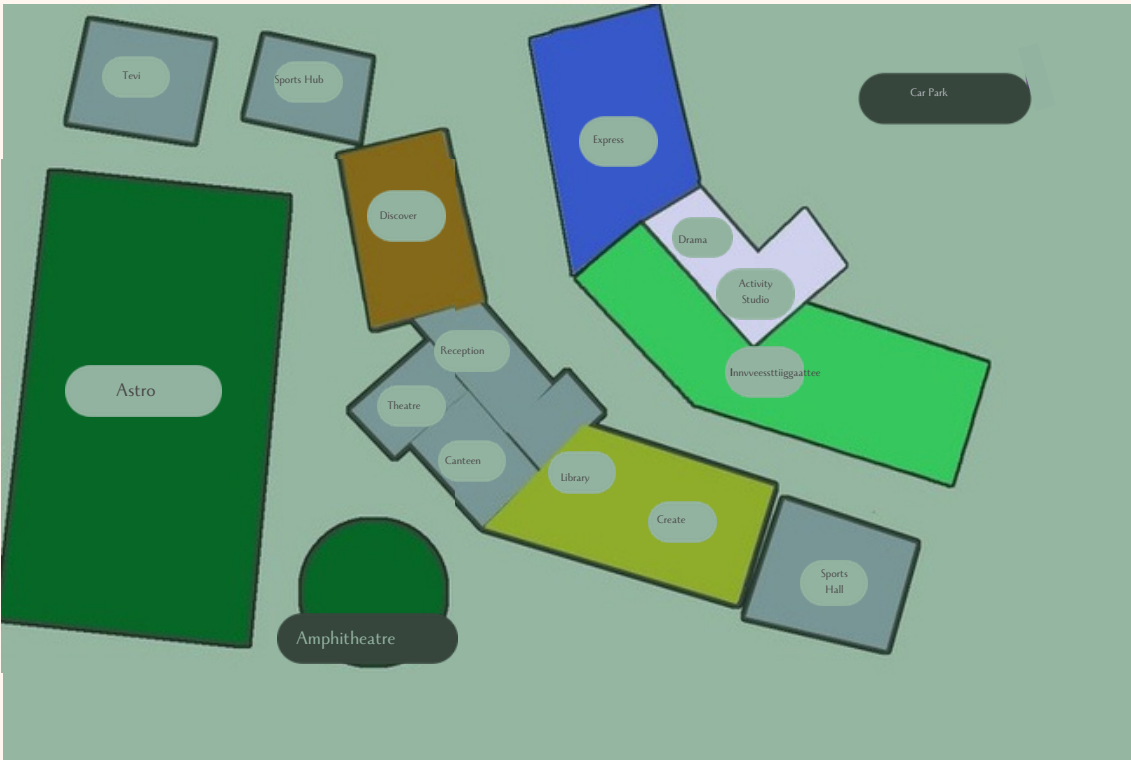

The Brannel School blazer, with embroidered logo, is a mandatory item of uniform which must be worn every day. Students may also wear the optional black, V-neck jumper.

Essential uniform items:

- Plain white shirt
- Brannel school tie
- Brannel black blazer
- Black trousers, the Brannel skirt or black tailored shorts
- Plain black socks
- Plain black polish-able shoes

We will not accept:

- Any type of jean, chino, leggings, tight/skinny trousers or tracksuit style trousers.
- Trousers that do not reach the shoe line and display the ankle.
- Any type of coloured laces, high heels, canvas, coloured trim, suede material shoes, trainers with logos or boots.

You can have items delivered to Brannel for free or there is a small delivery charge for items to be delivered to your home.

Other uniform expectations

- Hair must be of a natural colour. No tram lines or extreme short cuts.
- No false nails (gel or acrylic) or painted nails.
- One pair of stud earrings and a watch. No bracelets, rings, necklaces or smart watches.



Brannel PE kit is required for all PE lessons and extra-curricular sporting activities. It is essential that students bring a complete change of clothes for PE in order to stay hygienic; this includes socks and footwear.

All students must wear the following items, which must be clearly labelled with the child's name:

- Brannel black and red sports shirt or sports polo shirt
- Plain black shorts (no cycling shorts), sports leggings or tracksuit bottoms.
- Brannel socks
- Sports trainers
- Stud boots (for school rugby and football teams)



Advised items:

- Shin pads (football)
- Red 1/4 zip sports jacket with Brannel logo (again, highly recommended due to PE being outside year round)



Optional items:

- Rain jacket with Brannel logo
- Reversible jacket with Brannel logo

Prepared to Learn

These include everything that your child needs to be lesson ready in September. These will be distributed on the first day of term. The pack includes:

- Scientific calculator
- Pens - required colours
- Pencil and rubber
- Ruler
- Whiteboard and whiteboard marker
- Reading ruler
- Student wallet - this is large enough to keep all of the equipment in, so that it is always together in one place.

Students are expected to have these with them everyday and this will be checked each morning as they arrive in school. They will be expected to have their equipment packs out in every lesson.

Class Charts

You can use Class Charts to track the achievement (merits or positive points), behaviour (consequences including detentions), and attendance as well as viewing your child's timetable. You can also view announcements from Brannel school.

Class Charts for parents can be accessed through the Class Charts website www.classcharts.com, an iOS or Android app. You will receive a code to do this on the first day that your child is in school.

If you have more than one child, you can access Class Charts information about your children from a single, centralised parent account - we can support you to do this if necessary.

We offer a range of support to help you feel safe, supported and ready to thrive. At Brannel School, we want to ensure that all of our students feel happy and safe at all times.

Our pastoral and safeguarding support includes guidance, advice and information to students and their families within our school community, helping with any worries or concerns that may arise in relation to your child's education, attendance, behaviour and wellbeing. Our role includes liaising with staff, parents and outside agencies to ensure the wellbeing of individual students is fully supported.

If pupils need to access any of the team, they are available every break and lunchtime and also provide targeted interventions for individuals and small groups during the academic year.



MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT TEAM

Our trained team is here to listen, support and help you manage your wellbeing and mental health.



FOOD BANK

We have a food bank available for students and families who may need a bit of extra support.

Where do I find information about buses?

All the information you need around school buses and school transport can be found **here**.

Are there any after school clubs?

Yes! There is an extensive enrichment offer available to students at lunchtimes and afterschool. This is updated termly, but examples of activities that have been run this year can be found **here**.

What happens if I forget my PE kit?

You can borrow kit from the sports hub. At break or lunch, you can go to reception and call home to see if someone can bring it in for you. You can get a locker from reception, for £5 per year, to keep coats and PE kits in.

How do I know about homework?

All independent learning is set through **ClassCharts**. Students will be shown how to use these programmes in September. They can be downloaded as an app for quick checking. Parents can also download the parent version of **ClassCharts** to keep an eye on what their child is being set.

What if another child is unkind to me/ my child?

Students should see their tutor, head of year or year manager. We will support the students to get this resolved as fast as we can. It is important for pupils to talk to staff about any problems they might have.

How do I pay for my food at school?

Hot food is available at break and lunchtimes. You will be given a proximity card in September and money can be loaded on this via **ParentPay**. Free School Meals money will be added automatically. To check whether you are eligible for free school meals, please visit **www.cornwall.gov.uk/schoolmeals**

It is imperative that we hold up-to-date contact details. We also operate a texting and emailing service to parent/carers with news and updates.

ClassCharts

ClassCharts is an online platform used by our staff to record students' achievements, attendance, and behaviour throughout their time at school. As a parent or carer, you will be able to use ClassCharts to monitor your child's progress, view behaviour reports, and access assigned homework tasks. Login details will be shared with you when your child joins us in September.

Curriculum

In Year 7, students begin by studying a broad range of subjects from the KS3 National Curriculum and beyond, helping them to build strong, knowledge-rich foundations. By Year 9, students personalise their learning by selecting their GCSE options.

To ensure a balanced and varied curriculum, all students follow a two-week timetable (Week A and Week B).

Entering and exiting Brannel School

All students should arrive to school via the external gates on Rectory Road. The gates are open from 7:30am. Students must be through these gates by 8:25am. At the end of the school day, students must then leave the school site via the same points. If they are travelling via a dedicated school bus, these will wait outside the front of the school. If the bus has arrived, they can board straight away. Staff will be on duty to help students find their bus and tell them where to stand if they are waiting.

Essential Equipment

We want students to have all the equipment they need to progress with learning and feel prepared. Every day the students must bring their mandatory items of equipment (Page 7). It is important that their equipment pack is kept in good condition and brought into school everyday. Replacement items can be bought through ParentPay **here**.

First Aid and Medical Support

Qualified first aiders are available throughout the school day for emergencies only. If students require ongoing medical support, the first aid team will provide appropriate assistance.

Homework Guidelines

Learners will receive 20 minutes of homework per week for: English, Maths, Science, MFL, History and Geography. All homework will be provided through dedicated Year 7 Homework Exercise Books, with tasks and resources pre-populated and space provided for completion. This ensures that every learner has access to the same high-quality materials and can complete homework successfully without additional resources.

Medical and Dental Appointments

Where possible, we advise that medical or dental appointments are made outside of school hours. If students need to attend an appointment during the day, please inform the Attendance Officer prior to the appointment (pupilabsence@brannel.celtrust.org) and include evidence of the booked appointment.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones should not be seen or heard anywhere on the school site. This means that as soon as pupils arrive at school, phones must already be switched off or on silent and kept securely in their bag. Phones should not be taken out during the school day for any reason and can only be used once the pupils have left the school site at the end of the day.

This expectation reflects national guidance followed by schools across the country to ensure a calm, focused, and safe learning environment, free from distraction.

Movement

We want everyone to feel safe, so we ask students to walk quietly and calmly in the corridors and between buildings. When moving around the school, students should keep to the left-hand side where appropriate.

ParentPay

A secure, online service used to pay for school meals, trips, instrumental lessons and more. ParentPay offers parents/carers the freedom to make payments whenever and wherever they like - safe in the knowledge that the technology used is of the highest security available.

Parents/carers will have a secure online account, activated using a unique username and password. If you have more than one child at our school, or children at other ParentPay schools, you can create a single account login for them all. Parents/carers will receive their unique ParentPay account activation details in September.

Personal Items

Brannel School is not responsible for personal items brought onto the school site. If your child wishes to bring personal, expensive items into school, then students are responsible for the safe-keeping of these items.

Progress Evenings

We hold regular Progress Evenings throughout the year to support a strong partnership between school and home in guiding students' learning. These include a 'Meet the Tutor' evening, where parents and carers will have the opportunity to raise any initial concerns. The dates for these events will be shared in September as part of the school calendar.

Progress Reports

Students will be issued with progress reports twice across the school year. These reports give details about how students are progressing and engaging with learning in each subject.
